Get Your Application Fee Paid For!

If you are, or have ever been, in extended society care (formerly a crown ward) your application fee (\$110 college fee/ \$150 University) can be reimbursed through an application at:

Other conditions to the reimbursement are that you haven't completed a post-sec diploma already, and that you have applied to OSAP.



Though the Children's Aid Society of Nipissing & Parry Sound does not pay for student's postsecondary education, we can help you to connect to many financial supports.



Applying and Accepting College University

Apply to any publicly funded Ontario college program at the OCAS website:

www.ontariocolleges.ca.

Applications typically open in early October, but you have until the February 1st equal consideration deadline to apply.
You can still apply after February 1st, but some programs might be full.

The cost for an application is \$110. This allows you to apply to up to 5 program choices (no more than 3 at any one college); the programs must start within the same academic year (August to July).

You will typically begin to hear back with offers via email in March-April and must formally confirm an offer by May 1st on the OCAS website.

Once you confirm acceptance, you will start getting emails directly from your college via email with a student number and instructions to set up a student account.

Start Saving!

Most Colleges and Universities require a Tuition Deposit on June 1st to hold your seat. Typically, \$250 for college and \$500 for university.

Detailed instructions for applications, for both current and non-current high school students are available through the how-tovideo tab.

(Note that to create a OUAC you will need a MIDENT number (received from your school at the end of November.)

Applications typically open in early December, and close on January 12th.

The cost for a typical Undergraduate University application is \$150. This allows you to apply to up to 3 program choices. Each additional choice beyond 3 is an additional \$50 per program (with no limit to a number of choices) (Note that some specific programs may require supplemental fees)

You will receive acceptance responses including offers and refusals from each University via email starting in March or April and by the end of May.

PAC Tuition Waivers

Many Ontario colleges and universities offer a specified number of free tuitions for youth currently or formerly in care, VYSAs, CCSYs or RSGs.

Details and eligibility differ according to the institutions, and most require that you also apply for OSAP and provide a verification of CAS status.

OSAF

The Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) is a financial aid program that can help students pay for their post-secondary education. OSAP offers funding through **grants** (money you do not have to pay back) and **loans** (money that you must pay back once you are done school).

Applicants who are (or were formerly) in Extended Society Care, or who are in Voluntary Youth Service Agreements, Continued Care & Support for Youth agreements, or Ready Set Go agreements usually are eligible for specific grants and loans.

OSAP applications typically open in May but can be applied for even after your program begins. If you want to have OSAP money to pay your tuition installments, then it's best to apply early.

Don't forget to check the required documents section to complete and upload the various forms required to process your application!

Did vou know?

You can get a head start on OSAP by creating an account prior to the applications opening and making sure your income tax in completed for that year!

Applying to OSAP automatically considers you for a variety of bursaries!

Having a verified disability (physical, learning disability, Mental Health disability etc.) can qualify you for a Disability Bursary!

By verifying Indigenous status you may be eligible for additional variety of grants and bursaries!

I've Applied, Accepted, Now what?

Each college/university may differ but typically you'll need to start to:

- Create a budget using a budgeting app or tool (see panel left)
- Organize where you are going to stay.
 - Apply for residence (deadlines and processes vary). Is residence guaranteed for first-years, is it Coo-ed or gendered, on campus/off campus, single or shared? ...
 - Or start looking for off campus housing. Check the usually housing websites, and to see if your college/university has a off campus page on their website.
 - Most will require first and last month's rent or a deposit upon signing
- Pay your tuition deposit (\$250 college/ \$500 university) June 1
- Register for your classes/choose a timetable (sign up early to get your optimum schedule. This is also the time that you can defer your tuition payment until your OSAP arrives – varies, you'll typically receive an email with instructions between June 30 to August)
- Contact Nipissing Parry Sound CAS to see about a RESP (June-Aug)
- Register with Accessibility/Student Services if you had an IEP in high school. (Reach out in June-July to make sure things are set up for September)
- Start applying to scholarships and bursaries (May-ongoing)
- Check your email frequently for messages (both your private email and on any student account that you now have- ongoing
- Book a campus tour, take an online tour
- Frequently check your college's or university's social media page for events, info and resources
- Create a shopping/packing list" Personal items, Academic supplies, Kitchen and cleaning items, electronics, bedding and towels etc.
